Per your request, Global Environmental Engineering Inc. (Global) is submitting this response to clarify the building and window caulk observed at the Brookstone Apartments during the inspection on April 9 and April 13, 2012. Several layers of caulk were used during construction and maintenance at the seams of the building exterior siding. The bottom (oldest) layer consisted of a red/brown, brittle caulk that was determined through laboratory analysis to contain asbestos. The red/brown caulk was also observed on the exterior of the aluminum framed windows and patio doors. The red/brown caulk was brittle and could not be crumbled or reduced to powder using hand pressure. The material Global observed during the inspection was brittle and could be snapped into pieces similar to vinyl floor tile, but did not powder when brushed or crumble when hand pressure was applied.

On August 14, 2012 Global met with Ms. Jessica Magro, NESHAP Asbestos Inspector with the State of Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Air Quality Division to request her opinion on the friability of the red/brown window and building caulk. Ms. Magro confirmed that the red/brown caulk is non-friable and considered a Category II Non-friable material. Therefore, the red/brown window and building caulk at the Brookstone Apartments is considered to be non-friable and may be removed during the building demolition similar to asbestos-containing floor tiles. If any of the building materials contacting the red/brown caulk are to be recycled the material must be removed prior to recycling.

Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is union or non-union.

Union Identifiers

An identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" denotes that the union classification and rate have found to be prevailing for that classification. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2011. The first four letters , PLUM, indicate the international union and the four-digit number, 0198, that follows indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable , i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2011, following these characters is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate/collective bargaining agreement which would be July 1, 2011 in the above example.

Union prevailing wage rates will be updated to reflect any changes in the collective bargaining agreements governing the rate.

Non-Union Identifiers

Classifications listed under an "SU" identifier were derived from survey data by computing average rates and are not union rates; however, the data used in computing these rates may include both union and non-union data. Example: SULA2004-007 5/13/2010. SU indicates the rates are not union rates, LA indicates the State of Louisiana; 2004 is the year of the survey; and 007 is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. A 1993 or later date, 5/13/2010, indicates the classifications and rates under that identifier were issued as a General Wage Determination on that date.

Survey wage rates will remain in effect and will not change until a new survey is conducted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

- 1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:
- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on
- a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
